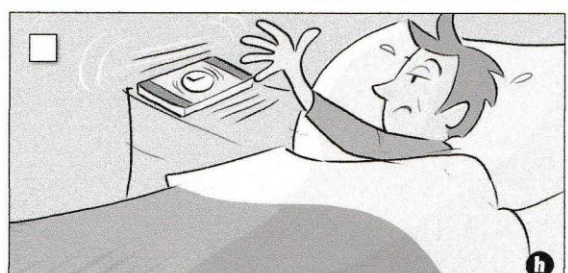
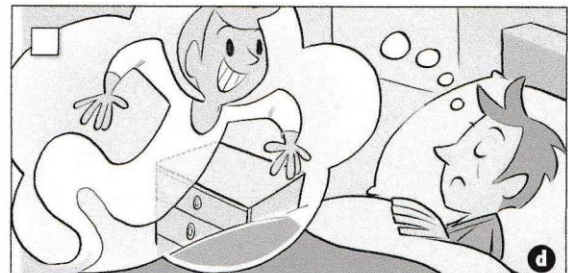
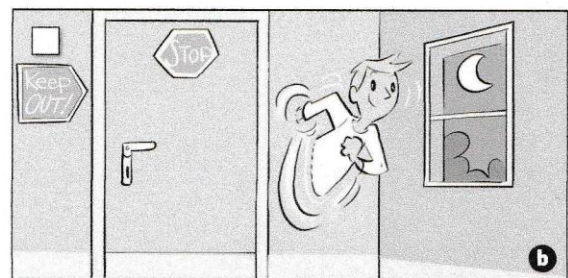
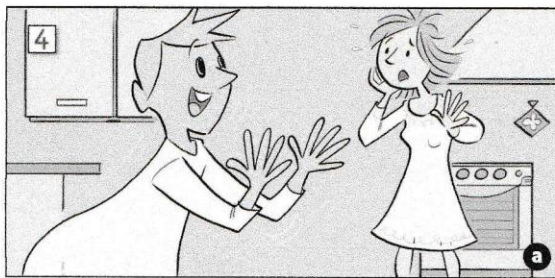
1 Read the text. Then number the pictures in the correct order.

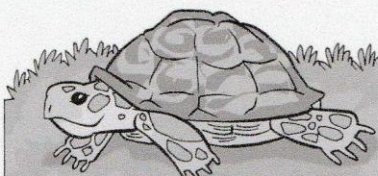

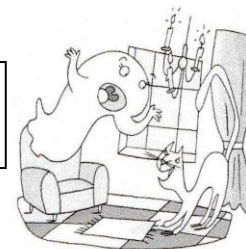
